

PACE Weekly: Recap of LeadingAge Updates

March 4, 2022

LeadingAge Coronavirus Call. New research evidence of a higher risk of heart attacks, strokes, and mental health issues after COVID. On Monday, March 7 at 3:30 PM ET, Dr. Ziyad Al-Aly, Director of the Clinical Epidemiology Center at Veterans Affairs St. Louis Health Care will talk about research from his center on the increased risk of cardiovascular and mental health issues up to a year after having COVID. He will talk about the importance of cardiovascular care post COVID infection in people of all ages, whether their COVID symptoms were mild or very severe. The cardiovascular research was published in Nature Medicine on February 7. He'll answer questions from callers and provide suggestions for aging services providers. New resources available from CDC on COVID-19 and infection control. <u>CDC's Project Firstline</u> offers resources to help frontline healthcare workers understand and confidently apply the infection control principles necessary to protect themselves, their families and their community. Webinar: Earned Income Tax Credit Information Now Available. New resources and information about the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) is now available on the <u>HUD Exchange</u>. The 2021 American Rescue Plan (ARP) expanded the EITC to include more workers without children as well as older workers (65+), temporarily raised the maximum credit for individuals without dependents from approximately \$540 to \$1,500 and increased the income cap to qualify for individuals without dependents from approximately \$16,000 to \$21,000. The EITC is not considered income and receiving these tax credits will not impact anyone's eligibility for federal benefits. The federal government along with hundreds of non-profit organizations, state and local governments, and members of Congress are engaged in an all-out push to make sure every eligible American receives the EITC by filing their taxes. With just over one month left until the tax filing deadline of April 18, join HUD, Treasury, and the White House on <u>Wednesday, March 9, 2022</u>, from 2:00 PM – 2:45 PM for a webinar on the CTC and EITC.

CMS Releases Medicaid "Unwinding" Resources. CMS issued new guidance to states about promoting continuing of coverage and distributing the eligibility and enrollment workload in the upcoming unwinding of Medicaid PHE related authorities. Biden Administration Releases New COVID-19 Preparedness Plan. The White House released a new <u>National COVID-19 Preparedness Plan</u>. It is focused on 4 key goals: 1) Protect and treat against covid; 2) prepare for new variants; 3) prevent economic and educational shutdowns; and 4) continue to vaccinate the world. Each of the four goals has a number of specific tactics, both for the Administration to execute on its own and for them to work with Congress to achieve.

Interview with Dr. Michael Fine, author and former Director of Rhode Island Department of Health. <u>Here</u> is an article featuring some of the highlights from our interview with Dr. Michael Fine, Chief Health Strategist for the city of Central Falls, Rhode Island. Central Falls has the distinction of having both the most COVID and the least COVID at different points during the pandemic. He talked about his views on the new CDC recommendations and the tension between politics and public health, COVID and the aging services workforce, and myths related to Omicron. He further suggested that we have not figured out how to best use rapid testing and should be using it more.

West Health Institute Requesting Feedback on Telehealth. <u>West Health Institute</u>, a nonprofit, nonpartisan applied medical research organization, is seeking to understand providers' barriers, goals, and experiences serving older adults via telehealth. They are working closely with subject matter experts from around the country to develop provider-focused principles, guidelines, and implementation strategies to support the use of telehealth with older adults. The results of this <u>10-minute survey</u> will be used in those efforts.

New Housing an Aging Society Program. The Joint Center for Housing Studies of Harvard University has launched a new Housing an Aging Society Program. The program will be led by Jennifer Molinsky, a 2019 LeadingAge Annual Meeting & Expo speaker and longtime research trailblazer on affordable housing issues and older adults. The HAS Program will have five research priorities: housing affordability and stability; safety and accessibility; neighborhood livability; housing, supportive services, and healthcare; and, housing options.
