

HOW TO FIND YOUR MEDICARE CCN



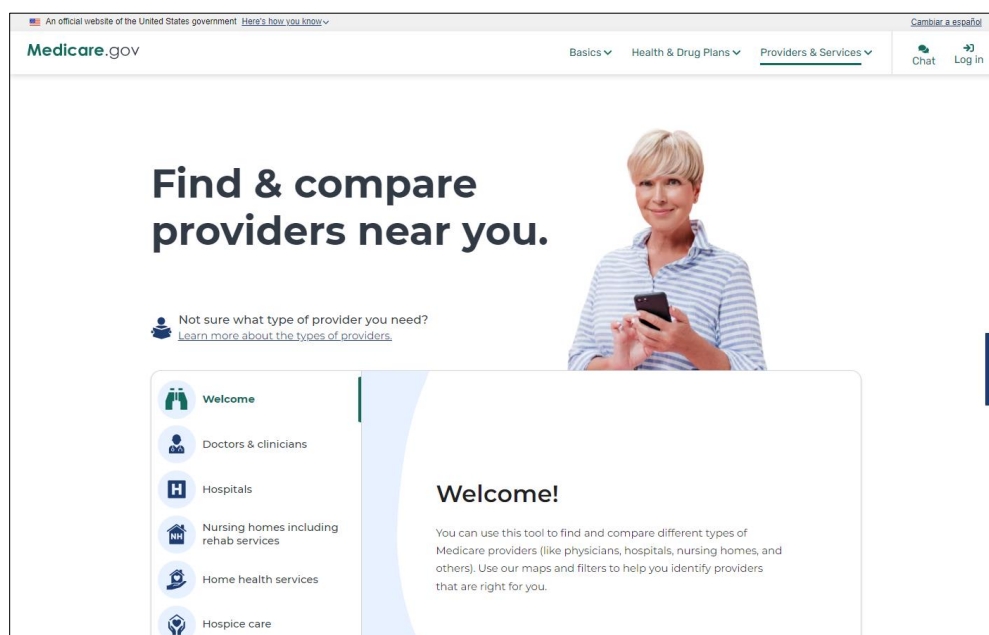
What is the CCN?

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Certification Number (CCN) replaces the term Medicare Provider Number, Medicare Identification Number or OSCAR Number.

The CCN is used to verify Medicare/Medicaid certification for survey and certification, assessment-related activities and communications. The CMS Regional Office assigns CCNs and maintains adequate controls. This number is associated with every hospice, home health, and skilled nursing home for public quality reporting.

How can I find the CCN manually?

1. Go to [Care Compare](#) and select your provider type (i.e. home health, hospice, skilled nursing home):



2. Type in your organization's name and, or address or a combination to find your provider page.

Find home health services near me

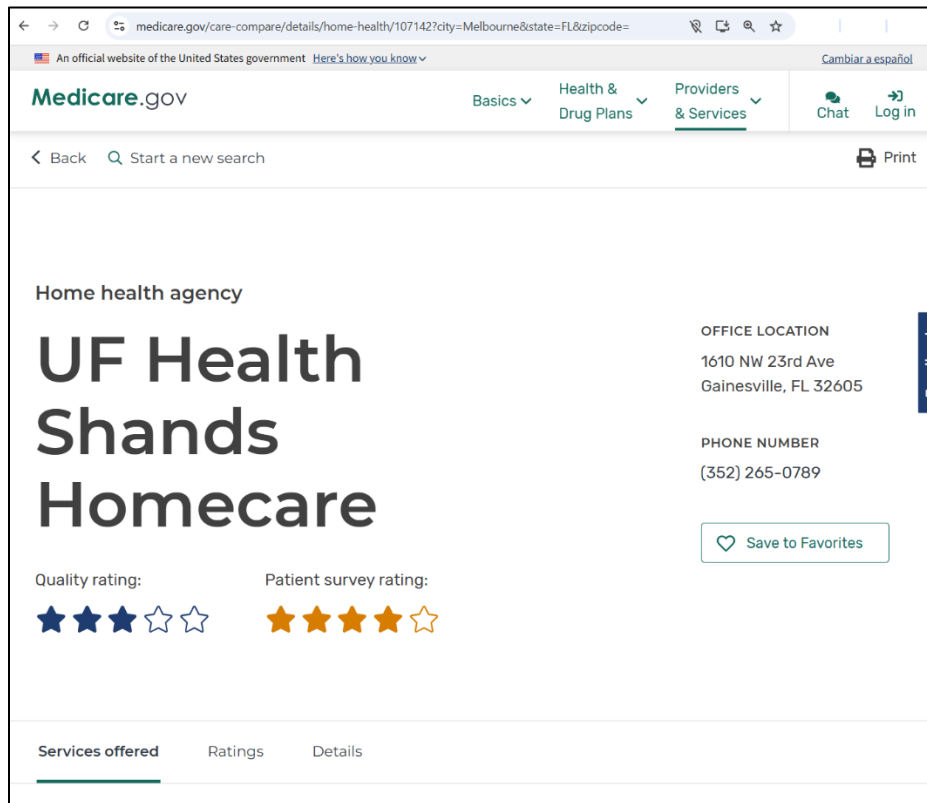
