

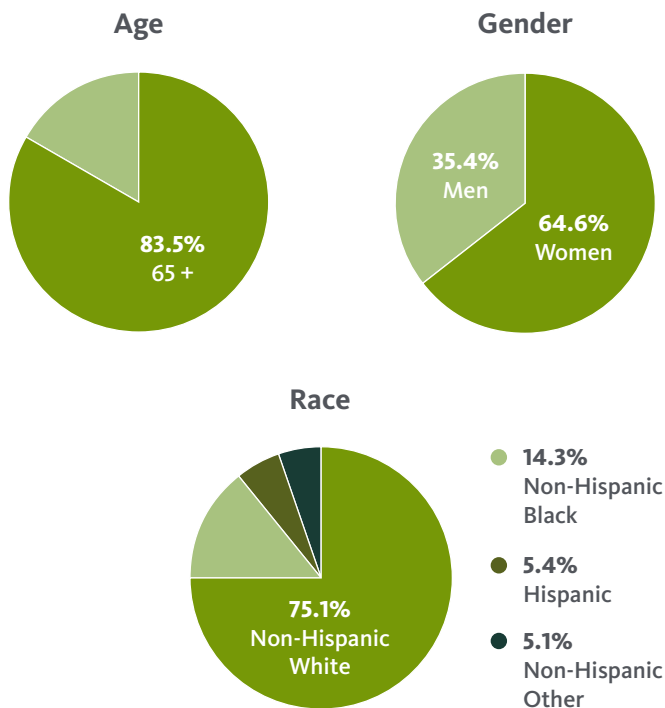
Nursing Homes

Older adults who cannot safely be on their own receive person-centered care in nursing homes, where their health, safety, and well-being are supported. Typically, these older adults require help with activities of daily living (ADLs), the fundamental skills required to live independently, including bathing, dressing, eating, toileting, walking and transferring from a chair or a bed. Nursing homes provide care to people with chronic conditions and co-morbidities requiring around-the clock 24/7 care, long-term care, and rehabilitation services such as physical, occupational, and speech therapies; IV therapy and wound management.

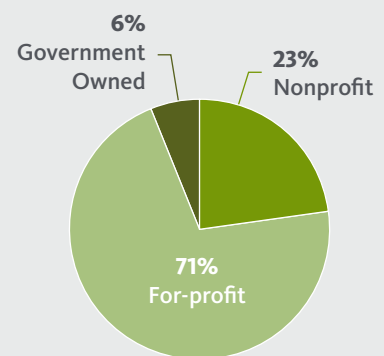

DEMOGRAPHICS OF RESIDENTS ^[4]

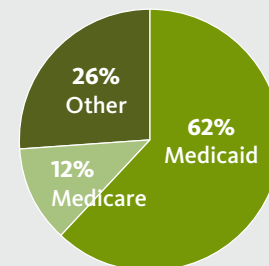
