Support for greater investment in services for older adults is *bipartisan*

- 92% of Democrats, 80% of Republicans and 84% of Independents say "the government must make a bigger investment in services and care for seniors."
- Only 14% of Republicans, 13% of Independents and 31% of Democrats say that "the amount of money the government spends on older people is too high."
- 9 in 10 Democrats and 8 in 10 Republicans and Independents agree **now is the time** to think about **building a better system for our seniors**.






