## Support for greater investment in services for older adults is bipartisan

- $92 \%$ of Democrats, $80 \%$ of Republicans and $84 \%$ of Independents say "the government must make a bigger investment in services and care for seniors."
- Only $14 \%$ of Republicans, $13 \%$ of Independents and $31 \%$ of Democrats say that "the amount of money the government spends on older people is too high."
- 9 in 10 Democrats and 8 in 10 Republicans and Independents agree now is the time to think about building a better system for our seniors.
